10:30 Weed Supervisor Keith Goens

Goens met with the Commissioners to discuss several grants he is applying for: A competitive weed and pest grant in the amount of \$5700; wild parsnip, queen Ann's lace and common tangy; \$2600.00 grant from the state and in kind of \$2600.00 for control of poison hemlock in the county. Goens talked to the Commissioners about the possibility of hiring another person for spraying. Goens said they are in the process of putting together a weed tour with other counties to identify weeds with May 24 being tentative date. Jaeger commended Goens for providing the Commissioners with reports and for seeking grant funding.

11:00 EM/Deputy Cory Borg

Borg requested approval to attend EM multi Hazard Planning for Schools April 6-7 in Pierre; this is for the SLA; Sheriff Office Tactical Combat Casualty Care Conference April 10-13; train the trainer and becomes an instructor and bring material and information back; would count for 40 hours of education. PDM Plan; is waiting for a couple of cities to adopt the plan and then it will be sent to 1st Dist., then to FEMA. Homeland security grant funding meeting was held recently; prioritized projects for the region. He said the Sheriff's Dept. is working on Crystal Springs Rodeo June 21-24 and a rodeo to be held in Gary July 1 & 2; all staff will be working both rodeos. The National Guard will hold a weekend drill March 31-April 1 at the 4-H grounds in Clear Lake that will include an open house at the community center March 31.
