BRIDGE REINSPECTION PROGRAM RESOLUTION FOR USE WITH SDDOT RETAINER CONTRACTS RESOLUTION #21-08

WHEREAS, 23 CFR 650 Subpart C, requires initial inspection of all bridges and reinspection at intervals not to exceed two years with the exception of reinforced concrete box culverts that meet specific criteria. These culverts are reinspected at intervals not to exceed four years.

THEREFORE, Deuel County is desirous of participating in the Bridge Inspection Program using Bridge Replacement funds.

Deuel County requests SDDOT to hire **Banner Associates** (Consulting Engineers) for the inspection work. SDDOT will secure federal approvals, make payments to the Consulting Engineer for inspection services rendered, and bill the County for 20% of the cost. Deuel County will be responsible for the required 20% matching funds.

A joint public hearing with the Zoning Board was held upon the request/petition of Will Stone to issue a change in zoning classification for property that is described above in 5-114-47, Norden Township from Agricultural to Lake Park District. The property will be used for camping which is located near a bed and breakfast. After discussion, the Deuel County Zoning Board stated the property meets all the requirements of the ordinance. The Planning Commission will vote to recommend approval of this ordinance to the County Commissioners. Upon vote the motion carried. The Planning and Zoning Commission adjourned.

The Commissioners continued the public hearing for questions on the rezoning classification.

The Commissioners then held the first reading of Ordinance B2004-01-34A. The second reading will be held at the April 6th regular Commission meeting at 9:30 a.m.

11:00 Deb Lessman for Extension Office

Lessman met with the Commissioners to discuss several things. She wanted to clarify that she secured signage quotes for the Extension Office (or Deuel County Complex) on the request of the commissioners. This included the 4-H logo as well as SDSU logo (both illuminated) at a cost of \$3894.00 plus \$50.00 acquisition. After further discussion with Shooting Sports leaders it was determined that there was no need for a Shooting Sports logo to be a part of the signage. Commissioner Jaeger suggested to contact LATC to see if the students there would be interested in doing the project through courses offered there. They asked Lessman to look into other quotes before committing to Stein Sign.

Discussion was held between Lessman and the Board about the needs of the Extension Office and the availability of capital outlay funds. Lessman gave some history on the 4-H Service Center. She suggested updates on flooring, bathrooms and bleachers for the Fairgrounds. A capital outlay resolution amendment to add capital outlay funds from the general fund will be presented next meeting by Auditor Korth. This will be for updates to the 4-H Service Center and Grounds as well as Courthouse improvements.

Discussion was held on a grant available through LWCF (Land & Water Conservation Fund). This fund matches federal money to acquire park land and develop public outdoor recreation facilities. An inspection report to verify previous grant funds used for the Deuel County Horse Show Ring was received. 14) Jaeger moved, seconded by Rhody to approve and sign the compliance inspection report of the Deuel County Horse Show Ring ensuring the entire park property is still available for public outdoor recreational use and checking on the condition of the facilities. All voted yes and motion carried.

11:30 Emergency Manager Sheila Monnier

Monnier met with the Commissioners to discuss the PDM (Pre-Disaster Mitigation). She would like the Board to review the PDM and if they have any suggestions or concerns to please let her know very soon as she is having upcoming meetings involving the PDM.

11:35 Sheriff Cory Borg

Borg met with the commissioners to discuss building a shooting range for the Sheriff's Department at the Highway Shop on the east side. The Department's shooting practice has increased to a minimum of 4 times a year and it would be convenient to hold it at the County Highway Shop. This would not increase insurance costs. 15) Kreutner moved, seconded by Homan to approve the Sheriff's Department to set up a shooting range at the Highway Shop outside of city limits. All voted yes and motion carried.

Discussion was held on the Crystal Springs Ranch Rodeo and plans for security involving the large event planned for this year.

Borg was appointed to the 24/7 Advisory Board through the Attorney General's Office on March 10th.
