August 7, 2018 Regular Meeting

The Deuel County Commissioners met in regular session on Tuesday August 7 at 9:00 a.m. in the Commission Room of the Courthouse with Chairman DeJong presiding. Those present were Commissioners DeJong, Jaeger, Rhody, Pederson and Dumke. Also present was Auditor Pam Lynde. The meeting began with prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance.

Approval of Minutes

1) Rhody moved, seconded by Jaeger to approve the minutes of the regular meetings of July 3 and 17 and special meeting of July 30. All voted yes and the motion carried.

Approval of Agenda

2) Dumke moved, seconded by Pederson to approve the agenda as presented. All voted yes and the motion carried.

APPOINTMENTS

9:05 Highway Superintendent Jamie Hintz

Hintz met with the Commissioners to discuss several highway related issues. Discussion was held on the bid ready plan agreements for bridge replacement projects for Bridge 20-065-189 a replacement of concrete bridge in Hidewood Township; Bridge 20-065-196 in Hidewood Township. Hintz said cast in place bridges must be done according to state regulations. The BIG program is based on points with more points a project has the higher the ranking will be towards getting a grant. Points are awarded for condition of bridge; traffic count on bridges; detour length. 3) Jaeger moved, seconded by Dumke to approve and sign the letter of contract for engineering services for Bridge 20-065-189 and Bridge 20-065-196 with Banner & Associates with engineering services for each project not to exceed \$42,000 with amount including reimbursable expenses. All voted yes and motion carried.

4) Pederson moved, seconded by Dumke to schedule a public hearing for August 21st at 10:30 a.m. for the purpose of supplementing the 2018 Road & Bridge budget. All voted yes and motion carried.

Hintz presented a road use agreement for Hwy 212 detour project that would use County roads #309 west and #310 north to 212. Hintz will discuss further with the SD DOT and bring back to the next meeting.

The Commissioners also talked about the new overlay on County Road #310, 486th Ave from 166th Street to 179th Street. 5) Jaeger moved, seconded by Pederson to place a 9 ton load limit on County Road #310 from 179th to 166th Streets. All voted yes and motion carried.

Hintz also gave the Commissioners information on the possibility of using plastic culverts with pricing off the Minnesota state bid list; crush value is strong and won't rot. 6) Dumke moved, seconded by Jaeger to buy plastic culverts off Minnesota State bid list. All voted yes and motion carried. Hintz said the proposed overlay projects for 2019 are located three miles south in Grange Township on County Road #313 and three miles south of Toronto on County Road #317.

9:30 Deputy Cory Borg-Taser Upgrade

Borg discussed the need to upgrade the Tasers used by the Sheriff's Office. He said they currently have four Tasers and will eventually have to upgrade; current Tasers will not be able to be serviced after 2019. Borg presented two quotes, one to buy outright and the other proposal a five year contract, paying so much per year; Tasers would be under warranty for five years under the five year program and if purchased outright each has a one year warranty. If purchased all in one year the price would be 1022.00 per Taser and with added accessories cost would be 9416.00 for six Tasers; will outfit four deputies and sheriff and have one spare. The price under the Taser 60 program would be 1468.00 first year with trade in of used Tasers; years 2-5 payments are 1680.00 per year 8188.00 total payment. The possible purchase will be discussed further at the next meeting.

10:00 Director of Equalization Donna Rhody-Veteran & Elderly Assessment Freeze Requests

Director Rhody presented requests on two parcels, one for Disabled Veteran and one for Elderly Assessment Freeze for 2018 payable 2019 assessments. Both persons missed the April 1 deadline but otherwise qualify for the real property tax assessment freeze provided under SDCL 10-6A-4 and 10-4-40. 7) Jaeger moved, seconded by Dumke to approve the Elderly Assessment Freeze and Disabled Veteran Freeze for 2018 payable 2019 and abate difference of taxes (in 2019) on each parcel due to lower valuation. All voted yes and the motion carried.

10:30 Avangrid Renewables-Jesse Bermel, Mandy Bohnenblust, Brett Koenecke

Jesse Bermel representing Avangrid Renewables, a wind energy company, met with the Commissioners to discuss the wind tower project located in Blom and Scandinavia Townships of Deuel County. He introduced Mandy Bohnenblust the permitting manager for the project and Brett Koenecke attorney for Avangrid. Bermel gave a brief update on the wind energy project; 100 megawatts; 25-39 towers; 2.5 to 4.5 megawatt towers ranging from 250 to 500 feet. Mandy Bohnenblust will be working on permitting of the project; has been in the field over ten years; will be surveying within the next year and hope to start construction within a year. Koenecke stated because of the number of megawatts the project will not need to be permitted by the state PUC. Road agreements between the county, townships and Avangrid will have to be in place before the project is started. Bermel said they plan to start the permitting process with the Zoning Board in late 2018 or early 2019.

11:00 Drainage

8) Dumke moved, seconded by Jaeger to adjourn as County Commission and reconvene as Drainage Board. All voted yes and motion carried. Matt Bekaert presented an application to drain on the NE1/4 4-116-47 with the water flowing to the east with outlets in SE14 4-116-47 and N1/2 3-116-47 eventually into Crow Creek with the proposed length of the drain being approximately 6900 feet using five and six inch tile. He had secured the sign off of adjoining land owners and had secured the wetland determination. 9) Pederson moved, seconded by Dumke to approve and issue Drainage Permit #D18-10 to Matt Bekaert on the above described property. All voted yes and motion carried. 10) Dumke moved, seconded by Rhody to adjourn as Drainage Board and reconvene as County Commission. All voted yes.

State's Attorney Knight met with the Commissioners and discussed several items. Approve Cash Balance Sheet

11) Rhody moved, seconded by DeJong to approve the cash balance sheet for the month of July. All voted yes and the motion carried.
